

English

We encourage the children to read at least 5 times a week at home and ask that they or parents record this in their reading diaries. Children will take part in Guided Reading sessions where they will develop their comprehension skills.

Report Writing

Children will collect information about dinosaurs and then present it as a report. They will use the internet, books and the Natural History Museum in Oxford.

Poetry

Children will be reading, performing and discussing various poems, traditional and new, writing their own versions.

Letters to Favourite Authors

The children will be reading a variety of books by different authors and choosing their favourite. They will then write a letter to the author, explaining why they like their books and why they enjoy them.

Science Rocks and Soils

Compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock. Recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter

Music

•This term we will continue with recorder sessions on Monday afternoon further developing children's ability to read music and understand tempo and rhythm.



Art, Design & Technology

Self portraits using chalks. Children will use a variety of materials to make a collage of Henry VIII or one of his Queens. Discover the work of Holbein.



P.E and Games

During this term the children will be going to the field to take part in various games. It is also Sports Day so lots of practise – running, throwing and jumping.



Mathematics

Children will practise their mental maths skills weekly, through Maths Clubs, Doubles and Mental Maths tests, to build up their speed in answering questions.

Sessions this term will include:

- Place value
- Using addition and subtraction facts
- Adding 2 and 3 -digit numbers.
- Subtraction strategies: bridging the tens, place value and number facts.
- Weight - kilograms and grams.
- Handling data – linked to weight.
- Reasoning and explaining.

Computing

The children will continue to develop their keyboard skills and will use the internet for research. They will also use IT to select, record and organise sounds .

PSHE Changes

The theme seeks to develop children's ability to understand and manage the feelings associated with change.

History/Geography Tudors
